LOCATION/VENUE

Archery will be conducted at the Demmer Center (http://demmercenter.msu.edu) on the south side of the Michigan State University campus, 4830 East Jolly Road, Lansing, MI 48910. Athletes will use the indoor archery range. Automatic timing equipment will be used.

TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation will be available for both athletes and spectators to and from the Athlete Village and the Demmer Center. Bus schedules, maps, and other details will be available at Athlete Village.

RULES

 IDAF rules (http://www.2013WorldDwarfGames.org/PDF/Rules.pdf) will be observed. Athletes, coaches, and chefs de mission should be familiar with Parts 1 through 3 and Part 4 of the IDAF rule book.

CHANGE! Rule 4.6.4 states that "Field glasses and similar optical devices may be used for spotting arrows. Other equipment such as aiming devices, stabilizers, and compensators is not allowed." However, we have decided to allow sights for the 18m recurve bow event. Also, the crossbows come equipped with sights, so we have no choice but to allow sights.

- Archery equipment, including bows, arrows, quivers, finger tabs, and arm guards will be available from the Demmer Center. Athletes may use personal equipment if that equipment is comparable to the Demmer Center equipment. Personal equipment must be presented for inspection at check-in.
- Athletes must wear closed-toe shoes.
- Spectators are not allowed on the field of play (archery range).

Separate events will be contested for males and females in each age division. Because of the large number of entries, the competition host has decided to assign archers two-to-a-lane.

EQUIPMENT

The equipment of choice for the crossbow competition is the Horton Eagle Youth Crossbow. The equipment of choice for the recurve bow competition is the Cartel 58-inch, 16-pound recurve bow (a few 18-pound and 20-pound bows also are available). The Demmer Center will provide the aforementioned equipment for archers who do not bring their own

equipment. Both right and left handed bows will be available. Arrows, finger tabs, arm guards, quivers, and bow stands also will be available. Archers may use comparable personally-owed equipment if it satisfies inspection on the day of competition.

START LISTS AND CHECK-IN

- Preliminary start lists. Preliminary start lists showing the athletes entered in each archery event are included in this document and will be available at Athlete Village starting Friday, August 2.
- Archery check-in desk at the Demmer Center
 - Credentials. Athletes must wear their World Dwarf Games credentials when reporting to check-in.
 - Check-in. Athletes must check-in at the Demmer Center by the stated check-in deadlines, or they will be scratched from their events.
- *Final start lists*. Final start lists showing athletes entered in each event will be posted at the Demmer Center after check-in.

RESULTS AND AWARDS

Results will be posted on the 2013 World Dwarf Games web site, posted at Athlete Village, and distributed to chefs de mission in their Athlete Village mailboxes. Awards for archery events will be presented at the soccer finals at DeMartin Stadium on Thursday, August 8 between the Junior B and Open Men's finals. At awards presentations, athletes are expected to wear the uniforms designated by their nations' dwarf sports organizations.
